COVID-19 Mitigation Plan for Travel to Rural Villages and Off-Road System Communities "Reimbursement for Ministerial Services in Communities" Revised and Effective June 11, 2021

This Mitigation Plan revision follows guidelines per "Alaska Response and Recovery Health Advisory No 3 Intrastate Travel".

Any ordained minister or authorized traveler of the Diocese of Alaska seeking reimbursement or other compensation for travel to a rural community or village to provide pastoral or sacramental services must adhere to the following COVID-19 Mitigation protocols:

- 1. Anyone who is currently infected with SARS-CoV-2 virus or is COVID-19 symptomatic <u>MUST NOT</u> travel until they are cleared from isolation by a medical professional.
- 2. Travelers must receive prior Approval and Authorization to travel to the community from the Village or Tribal Council or appropriate local governing body and must <u>adhere to the community guidelines and requirements for travel</u>.
- 3. Travelers shall follow the local church's/congregation's mitigation plan and practice.
- 4. Fully-vaccinated travelers do not need to wear a face covering or social distance, unless stated by local/tribal governments, airline travel policies and/or the church's mitigation plan and practice.
- 5. If the traveler is asked to provide proof of vaccination and chooses or is unable to provide proof, they shall be treated as non-vaccinated and must follow non-vaccinated guidance.
- 6. Non-vaccinated travelers must
 - a. adhere to wearing face coverings in public when indoors.
 - i. Unless clearly stated by local community guidelines and requirements.
 - b. practice social distancing by staying at least 6 feet away from others.
 - i. Unless clearly stated by local community guidelines and requirements.
- 7. Traveler shall wash or sanitize hands frequently
- The minister must follow the guidelines for Holy Communion described in the Diocese of Alaska COVID-19 Public Worship and COVID-19 Mitigation Plans for Congregations.
 - a. "During this period of transition, Communion in one kind—the Bread only will continue until we are ready to return to the Common Cup."
- 9. The traveler must follow all additional local requirements or COVID-19 protocols.
